Chairman's	Nothing to report	
Report		
Secretary's	Minutes of the EGM, the new Constitution, and the new Code of	
Report	Conduct have been posted on the website and members have been notified of this.	
Treasurer's	The bank balance is £32,000. It has increased over the month due to a	
Report	VAT refund of £3,784. There was a penalty of £1,810 due to late	
	filing. At the AGM the Treasurer will make the members aware that	
	we have substantial debts that are not reflected in the accounts.	AG
	The auditor has promised to send the audited accounts within a few	
	days so that they can be sent out with the notice of the AGM.	
	The next VAT return has to be made in November, and it was agreed	
	that the outgoing Treasurer will handle this, and use the same tax	AG
	consultants as before. However, from then on, it is hoped that we will	
	be able to submit the returns ourselves.	
Membership	The membership form on the website has been modified to make it	
and Volunteers	clear that we are not rejecting existing members who do not have an	
	email address. The requirement to use email is only for new	
	members. Currently we have 15 members with no email address –	
	the rest (87) have email.	
AGM Planning	The notice of meeting and the various accompanying documents	
	were agreed. JW has prepared a Chairman's report and will send it to	
	the Committee for comment. Once this is agreed and the Accounts	
	have arrived back from the auditor NB will send them out. The	NB
	confirmed date for the AGM is Thursday 29 <sup>th</sup> September, (since	
	<b>changed to 19</b> th <b>October)</b> so the notice of meeting must be sent out	
	by Thursday 8 <sup>th</sup> September at the latest.	
	Several members have expressed interest in becoming Trustees. With	
	one exception, they have not said which vacancy they are willing to	
	fill. JW will try and persuade them to fill the officer vacancies.	JW
Matters Arising	Santa train service: Having asked the footplate crew for their	
	availability it seems that we will only be to run on 6 or maybe 7	
	operating days, whereas we had hoped to do 10. We need to operate	
	on at least 4 days to cover our operating costs. There is concern that	
	we may have difficulty in filling other posts, such as guards. And the	
	organisation of the service will need to be shared. JW will call an	
	open meeting of volunteers (preferably in the week beginning 5 <sup>th</sup>	JW
	Sept) in order to check availability, make a plan and assign	
	responsibilities.	
	Track repairs: We need to get the Sanderson working in order to be	
	able to load ballast into the Dogfish. We can then re-align the rails to	
	remove the twist. The intention is to have a Work Saturday with all	

	volunteers invited to come and help. Hopefully this will take place in	
	October.	
	<b>Riverside Halt trackwork:</b> The plan is for Alistair Connell to come and	
	supervise the completion of the first point and some work on the	
	second and third points. This could happen in October / November.	
	Annual Carriage & Wagon Inspections: These ought to be done	
	before the Santa trains start. Harvey Pole has started on the	
	lubrication but this is only a part of it. JW will ask Dave Allan if he has	
	a copy of the RDRPS C&W maintenance standard.	
	Purchase of impact wrench and other equipment: AG will continue	AG
	to look for suppliers in consultation with Keith. JW will seek advice	
	from Alistair Connell. New drill bits and 'chuck pins' need to be	JW
	bought.	
	<b>Draft SMS and Competence Management:</b> It was agreed that we	
	need to progress this in order to improve compliance with ROGS. We	
	will discuss with DRC.	
	Picnic Coach Project: It is understood that the members working on	AJ
	this are continuing to explore the possibility of hiving it off from	
	RDRPS, as we suggested.	
	Bridge of Bennie technical review: It is understood that the review	
	being undertaken by W Lippe Architects has raised concerns that one	
	of the gabion walls is moving, and has advised that Fairhursts be	
	asked to say whether this is acceptable. Keith Robertson and Paul	
	Gunning are to measure what movement, if any, has occurred, in	
	order to provide data on which Fairhursts will make their assessment.	
	Birkenbaud Crossing consultation document: It was agreed that this	
	document, which needs further work, needs to be discussed with	
	DRC.	
	Management study: JW reported that Peter Ovenstone of HRA had	
	ruled himself out of leading this, due to a possible conflict of interest.	
	JW has asked Peter to try and find someone else.	
	Queens's Messenger 2022: JW reported that Ben Fawkes has	
	confirmed that his is willing to help with this.	
AOB	Glen Barry station building: JW reported that members he had	
7.05	consulted were enthusistic about saving this building, so plans would	
	be made to achieve this.	
	Trustee's report to OSCR: AG suggested that we prepare a new	
	report rather than just copying previous ones. AG will draft this.	AG
	JW reported that the new Constitution has already been sent to	
	OSCR, and he confirmed that they had not commented on the draft	
	we sent them.	
	<b>Leys Estate:</b> It was reported that they intend to remedy the problems	
	we have with water supply. They are willing to cut down a few	
	trackside trees that are fouling train movements. They wish to divert	
	the Deeside Way through our car park and will send us a proposal for	
	comment.	
	Water tank wagon: JW confirmed that it is still our intention to bring	
	this wagon to the Railway for use in providing water to Bon Accord.	
	He is continuing to liaise with the Speyside Railway on plans for	
	getting it here.	
	<b>Break-in at the Layby:</b> Our scaffolding tower was stolen. Police are	
	investigating. JW thinks we might get a replacement donated to us.
